NON FUNDED CHALLENGE COST SHARE AGREEMENT Between The GEORGETOWN FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT And The USDA, FOREST SERVICE ELDORADO NATIONAL FOREST

This NON FUNDED CHALLENGE COST SHARE AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between the Georgetown Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Cooperator," and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Forest Service, Eldorado National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the authority: Department of Interior and Related Agencies Appropriation Act of 1992, Pub. L. 102-154.

Title: Quintette Station Engine Storage Partnership

I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this agreement is to document the cooperation between the parties to store Cooperator's Type 3 or smaller fire engine in the U.S. Forest Service, Eldorado National Forest Quintette Fire Station located on federal lands at the intersection of Wentworth Springs Road and Sand Mountain Blvd., Quintette, California and the use of the Cooperator's training facility and expertise regarding Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) in accordance with the following provisions and the hereby incorporated Financial Plan, attached as Exhibit A.

II. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFIT AND INTERESTS:

Both the U.S. Forest Service and Cooperator have mission to protect the wildland area surrounding the Quintette Station. The Cooperator can support fire suppression more readily from this location. Additionally, the sharing of SCBA expertise benefits both agencies in the event it use were necessary during mutual aid.

In consideration of the above premises, the parties agree as follows:

III. COOPERATOR SHALL:

A. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. Cooperator shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the nonfederal share of project costs, when applicable.



- B. <u>BUILDING AND COMPUTER ACCESS BY NON-U.S. FOREST SERVICE PERSONNEL</u>. Cooperator may be granted access to U.S. Forest Service facilities and/or computer systems to accomplish work described in the Operating Plan or Statement of Work. All non-government employees with unescorted access to U.S. Forest Service facilities and computer systems must have background checks following the procedures established by USDA Directives 3800 series. Those granted computer access must fulfill all U.S. Forest Service requirements for mandatory security awareness and role-base advanced security training and sign all applicable U.S. Forest Service statements of responsibilities.
- C. Provide keys to any Cooperator equipment stored at the Quintette Station to move equipment as necessary.
- D. Provide a training facility including propane and other training materials for a yearly Forest Service live vehicle fire training.
- E. Provide qualified personnel to assist Forest Service instructors on the topic of SCBAs and vehicle fires, propane fires and other related incidents requiring the use of SCBAs.

IV. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

- A. Maintain the Quintette Fire Station (U.S. Forest Service facility).
- B. House Georgetown Fire Protections District's fire engine.

V. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

B. <u>NOTICES</u>. Any communications affecting the operations covered by this agreement given by the U.S. Forest Service or Cooperator are sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:

To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the agreement.

To Cooperator, at the address shown in the agreement or such other address designated within the agreement.

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

- C. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This agreement in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or Cooperator from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- D. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of Cooperator's contributions made under this agreement do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of Cooperator's products or activities.
- E. NON-FEDERAL STATUS FOR COOPERATOR PARTICIPANTS. Cooperator agree(s) that any of Cooperator's employees, volunteers, and program participants shall not be deemed to be Federal employees for any purposes including Chapter 171 of Title 28, United States Code (Federal Tort Claims Act) and Chapter 81 of Title 5, United States Code (OWCP), as Cooperator has hereby willingly agreed to assume these responsibilities.

Further, Cooperator shall provide any necessary training to Cooperator's employees, volunteers, and program participants to ensure that such personnel are capable of performing tasks to be completed. Cooperator shall also supervise and direct the work of its employees, volunteers, and participants performing under this agreement.



F. NON-FEDERAL STATUS FOR COOPERATOR LIABILITY. Cooperator agree(s) that any of Cooperator's employees and program participants shall not be deemed to be Federal employees for any purposes including Chapter 171 of Title 28, United States Code (Federal Tort Claims Act) and Chapter 81 of Title 5, United States Code (OWCP), and Cooperator hereby willingly agree(s) to assume these responsibilities.

Cooperator agree(s) that, except as otherwise provided in this provision below, of Cooperator's volunteers shall not be deemed to be Federal employees and shall not be subject to the provisions of law relating to Federal employment, including those relating to hours of work, rates of compensation, leave, unemployment compensation, and Federal employee benefits. When Cooperator's volunteers are performing approved tasks identified under this agreement, the following applies:

- 1. For the purpose of the tort claim provisions of Title 28 of the United States Code, any of Cooperator's volunteers shall be considered a federal employee.
- 2. For the purpose of subchapter I of Chapter 81 of Title 5 of the United States Code, relating to the compensation of Federal employees for work injuries, Cooperator's volunteers shall be deemed civil employees of the United States within the meaning of the term "employee" as defined in section 8101 of title 5, United States Code, and the provisions of that subchapter shall apply.
- 3. For the purposes of claims relating to damage to, or loss of, personal property of Cooperator's volunteer incident to volunteer service, a volunteer shall be considered a Federal employee, and the provisions of 31 U.S.C 3721 shall apply.

Further, Cooperator shall provide any necessary training and support to Cooperator's employees, volunteers, and program participants, to ensure that such personnel are capable of performing tasks to be completed. Cooperator shall also supervise and direct the work of its employees, volunteers, and program participants performing under this Agreement.

- G. <u>MEMBERS OF U.S. CONGRESS</u>. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. 22, no member of, or delegate to, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or benefits that may arise therefrom, either directly or indirectly.
- H. NONDISCRIMINATION. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, and where applicable, sex, marital status, familial status, parental status, religion, sexual orientation, genetic information, political beliefs, reprisal, or because all or a part of an individual's income is derived from any public assistance program. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.) Persons with disabilities who require alternative means for communication of program information (Braille, large print, audiotape, and so forth.) should contact USDA's TARGET Center at (202) 720-2600 (voice and TDD). - I. <u>ELIGIBLE WORKERS</u>. Cooperator shall ensure that all employees complete the I-9 form to certify that they are eligible for lawful employment under the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 USC 1324a). Cooperator shall comply with regulations regarding certification and retention of the completed forms. These requirements also apply to any contract awarded under this agreement.
- J. SYSTEM FOR AWARD MANAGEMENT REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT (SAM). Cooperator shall maintain current information in the System for Award Management (SAM). This requires review and update to the information at least annually after the initial registration, and more frequently if required by changes in information or agreement term(s). For purposes of this agreement, System for Award Management (SAM) means the Federal repository into which an entity must provide information required for the conduct of business as a Cooperative. Additional information about registration procedures may be found at the SAM Internet site at www.sam.gov.
- K. <u>AGREEMENT CLOSEOUT</u>. Within 120 days after expiration or notice of termination the parties shall close out the agreement.

Within a maximum of 120 days following the date of expiration or termination of this agreement, all reports required by the terms of the agreement must be submitted to the U.S. Forest Service by Cooperator.

L. <u>PROGRAM MONITORING AND PROGRAM PERFORMANCE REPORTS</u>. The parties to this agreement shall monitor the performance of the agreement activities to ensure that performance goals are being achieved.

Performance reports must contain information on the following:

- A comparison of actual accomplishments to the goals established for the period. Wherever the output of the project can be readily expressed in numbers, a computation of the cost per unit of output, if applicable.
- Reason(s) for delay if established goals were not met.
- Additional pertinent information

Cooperator shall submit annual performance reports to the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager. These reports are due 90 days after the reporting period. The final performance report must be submitted no later than 120 days from the expiration date of the agreement.



M. RETENTION AND ACCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR RECORDS. Cooperator shall retain all records pertinent to this agreement for a period of no less than 3 years from the expiration or termination date. As used in this provision, records includes books, documents, accounting procedures and practice, and other data, regardless of the type or format. Cooperator shall provide access and the right to examine all records related to this agreement to the U.S. Forest Service Inspector General, or Comptroller General or their authorized representative. The rights of access in this section must not be limited to the required retention period but must last as long as the records are kept.

If any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit, or other action involving the records has been started before the end of the 3-year period, the records must be kept until all issues are resolved, or until the end of the regular 3-year period, whichever is later.

N. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552). Requests for research data are subject to 2 CFR 215.36.

Public access to culturally sensitive data and information of Federally recognized Tribes may also be explicitly limited by P.L. 110-234, Title VIII Subtitle B §8106 (2009 Farm Bill).

- O. TEXT MESSAGING WHILE DRIVING. In accordance with Executive Order (EO) 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," any and all text messaging by Federal employees is banned: a) while driving a Government owned vehicle (GOV) or driving a privately owned vehicle (POV) while on official Government business; or b) using any electronic equipment supplied by the Government when driving any vehicle at any time. All Cooperators, their Employees, Volunteers, and Contractors are encouraged to adopt and enforce policies that ban text messaging when driving company owned, leased or rented vehicles, POVs or GOVs when driving while on official Government business or when performing any work for or on behalf of the Government.
- P. GOVERNMENT-FURNISHED PROPERTY. Cooperator may only use U.S. Forest Service property furnished under this agreement for performing tasks assigned in this agreement. Cooperator shall not modify, cannibalize, or make alterations to U.S. Forest Service property. A separate document, Form AD-107, must be completed to document the loan of U.S. Forest Service property. The U.S. Forest Service shall retain title to all U.S. Forest Service-furnished property. Title to U.S. Forest Service property must not be affected by its incorporation into or attachment to any property not owned by the U.S. Forest Service, nor must the property become a fixture or lose its identity as personal property by being attached to any real property.

Cooperator Liability for Government Property.



- 1. Unless otherwise provided for in the agreement, Cooperator shall not be liable for loss, damage, destruction, or theft to the Government property furnished or acquired under this contract, except when any one of the following applies:
 - a. The risk is covered by insurance or Cooperator is otherwise reimbursed (to the extent of such insurance or reimbursement).
 - b. The loss, damage, destruction, or theft is the result of willful misconduct or lack of good faith on the part of Cooperator's managerial personnel. Cooperator's managerial personnel, in this provision, means Cooperator's directors, officers, managers, superintendents, or equivalent representatives who have supervision or direction of all or substantially all of Cooperator's business; all or substantially all of Cooperator's operation at any one plant or separate location; or a separate and complete major industrial operation.
- 2. Cooperator shall take all reasonable actions necessary to protect the Government property from further loss, damage, destruction, or theft. Cooperator shall separate the damaged and undamaged Government property, place all the affected Government property in the best possible order, and take such other action as the Property Administrator directs.
- 3. Cooperator shall do nothing to prejudice the Government's rights to recover against third parties for any loss, damage, destruction, or theft of Government property.
- 4. Upon the request of the Grants Management Specialist, Cooperator shall, at the Government's expense, furnish to the Government all reasonable assistance and cooperation, including the prosecution of suit and the execution of agreements of assignment in favor of the Government in obtaining recovery.
- Q. <u>REMEDIES FOR COMPLIANCE RELATED ISSUES</u>. If Cooperator materially fail(s) to comply with any term of the agreement, whether stated in a Federal statute or regulation, an assurance, or the agreement, the U.S. Forest Service may wholly or partly suspend or terminate the current agreement.
- R. <u>TERMINATION BY MUTUAL AGREEMENT</u>. This agreement may be terminated, in whole or part, as follows:
 - 1. When the U.S. Forest Service and Cooperator agree upon the termination conditions, including the effective date and, in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated.
 - 2. By 30 days written notification by Cooperator to the U.S. Forest Service setting forth the reasons for termination, effective date, and in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated. If the U.S. Forest Service decides that the remaining portion of the agreement does not accomplish the purpose for which the award/agreement was made, the U.S. Forest Service may terminate the award upon 30 days written notice in its entirety.



- S. <u>ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT</u>. In the event of any issue of controversy under this agreement, the parties may pursue Alternate Dispute Resolution procedures to voluntarily resolve those issues. These procedures may include, but are not limited to conciliation, facilitation, mediation, and fact finding.
- T. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. Cooperator shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the Federal Government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should Cooperator or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- U. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this agreement must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change.
- V. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This agreement is executed as of the date of the last signature and is effective through **April 1**, 2025 at which time it will expire. The expiration date is the final date for completion of all work activities under this agreement.
- W. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement. 
